Campus Compact defines key competencies in Community
Engagement Fundamentals as the knowledge, skills, and critical
commitments that must be mobilized by community engagement
professionals to accurately and elaborately represent the foundations
of the field and the breadth of community-engaged work.



- 1. Knowledge of various conceptualizations of community and a working definition of community engagement
- 2. Knowledge of a set of guiding principles for ethical and effective community engagement
- 3. Knowledge of different modes of public service and civic engagement
- 4. Able to explain how effective community partnerships are related to the community engagement work of a college or university campus
- 5. Able to describe the nature of a strong community-campus partnership
- 6. Able to articulate the importance of equity and inclusion in engagement work, including the opportunities and challenges inherent in engaging students and other partners/stakeholders across lines of social difference
- 7. Able to describe the roles of engaged faculty, staff, and students on an engaged campus and the issues they face
- 8. Knowledge of the ways that community engagement can intersect with both curricular and co-curricular campus activities
- 9. Knowledge of examples of effective community and civically engaged teaching
- 10. Knowledge of examples of effective community and civically engaged research
