

*Sticky Family* is a story that emerged from a series of creative workshops that took place at Swarthmore College in Fall 2018 and were co-facilitated by me and Yaroub Al-Obaidi. A group of 20 participants—Swarthmore faculty and staff; students in a related Peace and Conflict Studies course taught by Katie Price and Peggy Seiden; and collaborators on the *Friends, Peace, and Sanctuary (FPS)* project told personal stories, created dynamic characters and stitched together a small mythos that resulted in the Sticky Family narrative.

Working on Sticky Family with *FPS* has been one of the best projects I have ever been a part of. I've spent months reflecting on our workshops and experiences together and feel so fortunate that folks trusted Yaroub and me to guide them through some pretty funny exercises to talk about real, honest, and difficult topics.
