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## **Engagement Journal Prompt Podcast Active Listening Prompt**

Write a 500-word (or more) entry in your engagement journal that demonstrates active listening to the assigned podcast episode.

## **Content:**

- 1. What is this specific episode about? Who speaks? Map out the organization of the episode.
- 2. Give specific examples: How do the creators of this episode demonstrate:
  - a. **Ethos** (how do the creators ensure audiences believe they are credible and trustworthy? Which voices/perspectives are included? Which voices/perspectives are excluded? What voices did you find most interesting or convincing? Why?)
  - b. **Logos** (how do the creators use logic to persuade audiences through the use of factual evidence/statistics and/or first-hand accounts? What might the creators have done differently to be more persuasive/informative?)
  - c. **Pathos** (how do the creators forge an emotional connection to the audience so that audiences care about this topic?)
- 3. How does this episode connect to issues of civic engagement and social justice?
- 4. What are 2-3 takeaways from this episode? What do you think the creators are trying to teach or promote to audiences?

## Form:

- 1. What do you notice about the presentation of the episode? What stands out most to you in terms of what you like and dislike about the episode's form?
- 2. What do you notice about the **sound effects and music**?
  - a. Consider the intro and outro music, the background music, feature music, audio clips, etc.
- 3. What do you think about the **cover art**?

Read the description/transcription of the episode--what do you notice about the episode notes?
